Suspension of Rules Related to 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) Response SUBJECT:

Governor Little has signed an emergency declaration to aid in the COVID-19 response effort in Idaho. Under Section 46-1008(5)(a), Idaho Code, the Governor may suspend the provisions of any regulations that would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency.

Several agencies have reached out to DFM about the suspension of rules that would aid in the COVID-19 response. This memo outlines the procedures such agencies should follow.

1. Temporary Suspension of Rules for Duration of the Emergency

If an agency would like to pursue a rule suspension directly related to the COVID-19 response, the agency must complete the following table for each rule chapter for which a suspension of a rule or rule subpart is requested. It must be submitted to Colby Cameron at DFM (Colby.Cameron@DFM.idaho.gov) no later than March 19th at 5:00 p.m.¹

¹ After this date, we will continue to accept requests for suspension of rules but are asking that as many as possible be submitted by this date to address this emergent situation.

• If approved by the Governor's office, the rule suspension will be published in an omnibus document on the Governor's webpage, and the specific rule suspensions must also be published on the agency's webpage with an adequate description that will apprise the public and your agency's stakeholders of the expectations during the emergency declaration.

2. Adoption of Official Temporary Rule

- The suspension of rules, as outlined above, is intended to be limited to the duration of the emergency declaration. In some instances, a temporary rule may need to be adopted if the agency believes flexibility will be necessary **during or <u>beyond</u>** the duration of the emergency declaration.
- In such instances, an agency may submit a Notice of Temporary Rulemaking (<u>sample forms</u>) for rule changes that are needed <u>specifically</u> to facilitate the response to COVID-19.
 - No ARRF needs to be submitted through DFM.
 - All other traditional rulemaking procedures must be followed under the Administrative Procedures Act.
- Agencies submitting for a temporary rule change must submit a completed Notice and the final rule text to Colby Cameron at DFM (<u>Colby.Cameron@DFM.idaho.gov</u>) no later than <u>March 26th at 5:00</u> p.m. Please note in the subject of the email that the rule is specific to COVID-19 so that the rule may be fast-tracked.
- Temporary rules may be effective upon adoption by the agency; DFM intends to publish all temporary rules related to COVID-19 in an April edition of the Idaho Administrative Bulletin.
