Call to Order

Board Business:

1). Renewal Applications:

2.) Minutes Approval for April 8, 2022: Action Item

3.) Budget:

- ❖ Ms. Volle presented the budget to the Board for review.

a. Training (Action Item):

- DVOMB. Ms. Volle is interested in attending. There will be CO SOMB representatives she can meet with. Colorado is one of the original SOMBs. - **IATSA Conference Discussion: Guest Shelly Osborne, President (Action Item)**
 - Ms. Osborne presented the plans and cost for the August conference. They are not doing a full Juvenile and Adult track this year because of cost. The largest unknown is attendance. The projection is 75-100 which puts at about a negative \$10,000. They are looking to bring in Sponsors to cover fees, travel and lodging for speakers.
 - Mr. Betts motioned to approve Cory Jewel, Brad Watts and Russ Pratt at \$9500.00. It was seconded by Mr. Marx and all members present voted aye. **Motion Carried.**

5.) Tiered Registry discussion.

- There was discussion of finalizing the number of tiers and years associated with each tier. The tools drive the tiers.
- There was discussion of categories, number of tiers and risk associated with all. The cost would increase with 5 tiers and it cannot be overly complicated.
- A lot of elected Prosecutors and law enforcement are for this.
- Research is not supporting registry is a decent way to reduce reoffending, it helps law enforcement with investigations.
- IDOC can provide specific numbers. Population density contributes and demographics make a difference.

- Sheriff's association will need knowledge of tiered registry to present for support.
- Discussion of tools used and the data behind those tools. All agreed to continue the use of Static and Stable moving forward to assess risk.

6.) Treatment Plan Template Discussion:

- Treatment should be driven by evaluation and dynamic risk variables. Providing treatment without evaluations is unethical.
- Standards require written consent and a signature should be required.
- Risk variables should be primary drive of template.
